## A Word from Our Founder

Dear Friends,

After 50 years, we can clearly see the cultural ramifications of legalized abortion in America. Everything Pope Paul VI prophesied in his encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, has proven true. While some of his projections for the decline of the family have not yet come to fruition in our country, they have indeed manifested in other parts of the globe.

**Essentially, women have been reprogrammed by abortion culture.**

Women are given the 'freedom' to deny their life-giving, nurturing design as mothers, and the Enemy has even deluded them into believing that this chosen lifestyle is a human right. Abortion is not freedom. It is oppression. And it strips away the rights of the life within.

Our team knows how to stretch each dollar you've gifted to us, prioritizing needs accordingly and flexibly finding alternative resources for clients with complex needs. **I am so excited to report that we have stayed within budget every month in 2024!**

We are also re-strategizing our LoveLine messaging for 2025. **While the abortion industry seeks to steal, kill, and destroy, we are reclaiming motherhood for women.**

On a personal level, 2024 was a year of healing and growth for me as a mother and leader. By allowing our Lord Jesus Christ to do His work in us, we feel amply ready with His guidance to do ours. Thank you for being on this mission with us. In moments of hopelessness for our culture, please remember—Jesus has already won, and we are on His side. **Let's bring as many with us to the side of Truth as we can and heal our abortion culture, one mom at a time.**

## From the Director's Desk

Dear Supporters,

When you hear someone talk about an impact, do you think about big, grand, large-scale, huge things? We are here to turn that upside down, which is often how the Kingdom of God works: in the least

expected way, not logically, and entirely only possible through Himself. **One small action, a ripple effect – one life changed, one life saved, one person loved.** That also can be of significant eternal impact. This Kingdom work is designed by, sourced, and rooted in the sovereign, relational God who created individual life.

In the Gospels, Jesus often spoke about caring for the "least" among us in an intentional message that directly challenges human nature: our desire to seek a platform, fame, fortune, and other earthly things, often with selfish motives and for our benefit. **If we do something for someone, many times, it's with the idea that they will do something for us, either now or in the future. It's a transactional focus.** As the Ruler of the upside-down Kingdom, Jesus said that if we serve one of the "least" or "little ones," it's as if we are serving Him. Many of His miracles helped the poorest, humblest people – the blind, the lame, the sick, the poor, and the demon-afflicted, including women and children. **These people could not do anything for Him, would not be able to pay Him back, and could not contribute financially to His mission. It was a transformational focus.**

That is what ProLove Ministries does through our LoveLine project. We want pregnant women or mothers of small children in an unexpected, complex situation to contact us. The Lord is a Father to the fatherless and a Defender of the husbandless (Psalm 68:5), and we want to serve these children and women with genuine love, the love flowing from the truth that is Jesus.

That doesn't mean we pay all her bills – although we will take care of rent, an electric bill, or a car

payment if it leads to her ability to see a future as a mother with her baby. That also doesn't mean we preach at her (verbally hitting her over the head with Scripture) – although we will pray with her, encourage her to be part of a local church, and talk openly about our faith and why it matters. We walk alongside her and encourage her to set and reach those goals. We model responsible adulthood. We help her learn how to budget and manage household finances. **We often help break generational cycles that include none of these things. She is capable of more, and our Lord wants more for her and her children.** He is the God of abundant life and can do exceedingly more than we can think or imagine (Ephesians 3:20).

Our LoveLine case management program is an individualized approach to her unique situation. Our framework allows for individualized care according to her circumstances and timing. We move her through our program by empowering her to set her own goals and make progress toward reaching those goals – with a code of ethics and clear expectations that keep us on track and demonstrate that we hold her accountable as well as ourselves.

I mentioned the ripple effect. We don't know and cannot know our work's complete eternal or even earthly impact in this lifetime. Each conversation influences our clients whether they choose to act on our suggestions at the time or not. We do the work God brings us, we invest in each life, and He determines the outcome. He also determines the supply: His work, His people, His plans, His purposes, His resources. **We won't know all the "successes" until we reach Heaven. Thank you for supporting us with your prayers and financial gifts.**

# RECLAIMING MOTHERHOOD



Motherhood can be scary, isolating, and downright brutal, with or without support from fathers and extended family.

Women can expect more from motherhood — they can expect joy in the most challenging seasons. To heal our culture, we must heal it at its source. Transforming a culture of death to a culture of life must begin with mothers.

At LoveLine, we are reclaiming motherhood. These two beautiful moms wanted to share their stories with you. Thank you for providing the support our team needs to walk alongside them in their motherhood journeys!



## Rebecca's Story



"Mom's gonna talk for a moment. Can you go show me your toys?"

Rebecca, a first-time mom of a beautiful little girl with inquisitive dark eyes, takes a moment to settle her daughter during our conversation about her motherhood journey. Calm and comfortable, she appears to be made for motherhood.

"She is 19 months old, and she's very smart. So, trying to keep her occupied is fun. It's refreshing because it makes me think about how we think. We don't think of things the same way children do. So I have to get outside that, trying to keep her entertained. So it's a learning curve for me," Rebecca explains.

Rebecca and her daughter share an adorable apartment together. They have an established routine, and Rebecca has researched every aspect of childrearing, nutrition, education, and beyond. Her work allows her to be fully present in her daughter's life, which her father is not a part of.

"I came to LoveLine when I found out I was pregnant. The guy that got me pregnant with her was part of, I guess, a secret society or a club of some sort, and that kind of put things in fact. I already knew he wasn't going to want me to keep her, and because of my faith, I already knew I couldn't get rid of her," Rebecca shared. "So I told him after it took me some time to gain some courage to tell him because those conversations you don't really want to have with a guy, especially one you don't know very well. He tried to convince me to abort her."

Rebecca told him that abortion was not on the table. He disappeared and did not message Rebecca again until a year and a half later.

Rebecca was left to face her pregnancy alone. Overwhelmed, she quit her job, unable to process or discern her next steps. She remembered a resource where she could get free ultrasounds. Rebecca began visiting Life Clinic to glimpse her child - and her hope - growing within her.

"I had another job lined up, but I was in a position where I had no money coming in. At one of my appointments at Life Clinic, I just broke down. I

started crying and telling them about my circumstances," Rebecca recalls.

"There was a lady there who was just so warm and gave me this number. She said, 'I just feel like God is telling me to give you this number.' It was LoveLine. I contacted [LoveLine] immediately."

However, Rebecca doubted that LoveLine would help her due to her past. Before her pregnancy, Rebecca was trapped in a sex trafficking situation.

"I'm able to talk more freely about it now because I've done a lot of healing. I've acknowledged the fact that I've needed God through it all. I feel like I was brought to LoveLine because of that situation, and it has been very good for me," she shares.

**"I've been able to make these sacrifices for her because of LoveLine. Having these resources and opportunities to learn how to better manage my money and have access to therapy during a very traumatic and important time of my life. It was a huge transition going into motherhood,"**

says Rebecca.

"Having somebody come alongside you is so important for that."

Rebecca knew of the Lord growing up but didn't yet know Him. Her environment was secluded and restrictive, and her parents were excessively authoritative.

"When I had the opportunity to live independently without my parents in a different city, I didn't know how to handle the things they tried to keep me from. I ended up in some very precarious situations, chronically homeless at the age of 18. I was living from house to house, couch to couch," recalls Rebecca.

"That just put me into a more vicarious situation with sex trafficking because I was desperate and didn't have any solid roots. I had grown up in a Christian household, but I grew up in a family that didn't demonstrate Christian values. They spoke about it. They try to portray that that's what they did, but that's not what they were doing. There was a lot of violence, a lot of hatred, a lot of anger behind closed doors. Not love, not unconditional love. So, when I had the opportunity to fly and make my own way in the world, I didn't have the right tools or know-how. When it comes to the sex trafficking side of my story, I acknowledge the fact that I just accepted it. I thought that's what I deserved," she continues.

Now firmly rooted in her relationship with God and identity in Christ, Rebecca realizes she deserves so much more: love, acceptance, and protection. All of this translates into her job as a crisis worker for a suicide prevention hotline.

During her pregnancy, Rebecca began losing hope that she would secure another job before the impending due date. "Because of my faith and because I know how God orders our steps, I just knew when my friend told me about this job, I said, 'God has that job for me.' I'm almost two years in and have seen how much it's changed my life," Rebecca shares.

Growing up with a hard-hearted mother has

helped Rebecca empathize deeply with crisis callers struggling with their own experiences of motherhood. Her relatable circumstances make her a safe place for people at risk of suicide.

When asked about her expectations versus the reality of motherhood, Rebecca can't help but compare her experience with others. She does so without self-pity but laments the

gone-with-the-wind village concept.

"I've watched other mothers that have made it so flawless, so easy, but they literally had that village that I was hoping to have. Having LoveLine, Life Clinic, and the community that I have been able to establish has helped make it easier. But as a new mother going

into motherhood, I think my expectation of motherhood was that it would be a lot easier than it actually is," she explains.

"They weren't lying that it's hard. You will make the sacrifices they tell you you're going to make. The reality is that people are going to have their opinions," continues Rebecca.

"If anything, it's shown me and taught me a lot of parts of myself that I've never seen before. I get so much positive feedback while second-guessing myself. I know that she is well-fed and she has great people in her life. She's safe. She's healthy. She's developing. She's got such a huge vocabulary, you know. So, yes, in a way, I'm doing great, but there's that voice, that nagging voice in the back of my mind."

"But there are also some other great parts that have taken me by surprise, which are good things that I want to talk about, you know, recognizing that I'm stronger than I thought I was. I had always had this huge fear of becoming a mom because I didn't want to be the mom that my mom was. But I'm not that mom. I'm a whole different mom who is so loving, accepting, and ready," Rebecca boldly professes.

Rebecca embraces the fact that she still has room for healing in her life so she can be fully present for her daughter. Whereas people did not show up for her, Rebecca resolves to do differently.

"I get to be that person for her. I get to heal through that. I didn't have the love and acceptance I have for her, even though she doesn't have her dad or grandparents in her life," she says.

Rebecca was blessed to live in the home of campus ministers and see what a real family looks like. Their example of unconditional love has helped expand her heart and allow her to share that kind of love with her daughter.

"They were far from perfect, but they worked through their problems. They set time aside for one another. They had date nights. They prayed together. I saw so many aspects and areas within this family that made me say, 'That's what I want for my family,'" Rebecca claims.

"I know what heartbreak looks like, and I know what love looks like. I know that you sometimes have to go through the bad to understand how good the good is. I will stand so firm on Jesus because Jesus has been my all through it."

Discerning that continuing contact with her daughter's father is potentially dangerous, Rebecca has not reciprocated his solitary message from nearly a year ago.

**"I view my role as [my daughter's] mom so important because God trusts us with these little souls that He gifts us. She's already talking about Jesus. She asks to pray,"**

Rebecca shares admiringly.

Utilizing LoveLine's crisis intervention, counseling, and financial coaching services, her team is confident that Rebecca is well-equipped to be the best mother she can be. Rebecca is satisfied in God's love for her as a Father. She has enjoyed working with LoveLine's team of moms, who have kids coming in and out of the picture during calls while her own child attempts to press buttons and smile at the camera during virtual visits.

When asked about her future, Rebecca says, "I feel so hopeful. I feel so good. There's a reason that she's here, that I'm here. God's been showing up in my life, but then He started showing up for my daughter. There's a big plan, and I want to align my goals and dreams with His plans. If He takes care of the birds, will He not take care of us? So, when I look at my future and my daughter's future, it's hopeful. And it's good."



# Kara's Story

Kara and her husband were struggling. Between jobs and on short-term disability, they felt stuck on a continuous loop of living check to check, borrowing money, and suddenly unsure of how they were going to make it when Kara discovered they were going to be parents. Kara knew they would need help to break out of the vicious cycle. And she knew they needed to be equipped to make it long-term, not just instant gratification with financial support.

Cue LoveLine. Three years into marriage and three months along in her pregnancy, Kara reached out to LoveLine, not knowing what to expect.

"I knew that LoveLine could help with bills and things like that, but the financial coaching is what really got me. Even if I didn't get help in the short term, I needed help in the long term, learning how to manage my money. And so I really had no idea what to expect," Kara explains.

The response pleasantly surprised Kara: "Everyone was so welcoming and nice, and just making sure I was safe gave me so much hope."

"It was so easy. I was most nervous that it would take a long time or, you know, it would be really complicated. But they [LoveLine] texted me back and set up a phone call. Pretty instantaneously, I was set up with a case manager and a financial coach," explains Kara. "Everyone was always really flexible and helpful."

Together with their case manager, Kara and her husband developed a case plan to dig her out of the financial hole they felt trapped in. Kara diligently worked on each step of her plan, accomplishing every goal. Her case manager connected Kara with resources she didn't know existed. Kara and her husband graduated from LoveLine's financial coaching program when Kara achieved her ultimate goal: enough financial security to pare down her job to part-time hours to be home with her newborn son.

Then, another challenge disrupted the newfound peace in their home.

"I had quit my job to be a stay-at-home mom, and I had taken on another job just on the weekends because we felt like that would be best for our family at the time. We figured that would help with burnout a little bit on my end and would help our marriage overall. I was very excited to be at home with my son. That was my ultimate goal. So I was super excited; we ran the numbers a million times,"

Kara shares. "And on paper, it was definitely something that we could do. What I did not account for was the fact that my husband was going through a lot on his own mentally that I had no idea about."

"So, all at once, everything flipped. He didn't want to be together anymore. That was, of course, after I had quit my job. He wanted me and my son to move out," continues Kara.

Unsure of where to go and what to do when she got



there, Kara felt panicked. She was too shocked to tell her family what was happening. Still, she desperately needed to share her plight with someone, so she contacted her LoveLine case manager again.

"I remember reaching back out to my case manager and financial coach, and I was very apprehensive about telling anyone what was going on. But they both knew me too well and eventually pulled everything out of me," recalls Kara.

"I didn't end up needing financial assistance that second time, but I needed someone to look at it all with me and say, 'Okay, you're gonna get this; it's gonna be okay.' So I ended up getting another job and working full-time again, getting my son into daycare, which I never thought I would do. But we're doing it, and it's been great for him and me both. I have my own place now that I was able to get into without any assistance. I'm so grateful that I reached out that second time," Kara reflects.

Walking through this turbulent situation with Kara, her case manager referred her to LoveLine's licensed counseling services. Postpartum challenges are complex, but the compounded layer of a broken marriage could have caused a downward spiral for Kara and her son. LoveLine saw the need and filled it. While Kara's experience of motherhood wasn't what she expected, it has not been without joy.

When asked about the reality versus the expectations of motherhood, Kara explains: "I think, of course, as women, as mothers, we are so good at trying to sugarcoat stuff to make it sound better than it is. LoveLine was there just to let me unapologetically be myself and meet me where I was in the moment. They never made me feel like I was being judged. They never made me feel like I was alone. They always made me feel like I had people on my side."

"Going through what I was going through while solo parenting was and will always be one of the hardest things that I've ever done. Having a baby sleeping in your arms that is fully dependent on you and knowing that your picture of motherhood is not going to turn out how you thought it was going to. No little girl thinks of being a single mom when they grow up, divorced at 23. Nobody thinks that that's going to happen to them. It was so scary to think that the picture-perfect life that I had planned for him was not going to be his life anymore," continues Kara.

Moving on with her life without the support of her husband and child's father, Kara has reconnected with a supernatural, God-given inner strength specially designed for mothers by our Creator. It has been an honor for LoveLine's team to witness her journey.

"While it was so hard, it's pulled a strength out of me that I did not know I had. We're making it. We still played every day. I never wanted my storm to get him wet," says Kara. "Especially with the help of LoveLine, I don't think it ever will."

"I'm definitely still able to feel the joy of motherhood in hard times. I think mothers are good at that. We always make the most of every situation."

Kara wants to encourage any mom who is afraid of taking that first step to ask for help:

"There are so many people who have gone through this, just like getting in line for a roller coaster. People will help you along the way. It's going to take time and it's going to be hard. You're going to have to have a lot of strength to ask for help, but once it starts going, it just starts going, and life starts getting better. That's really all I can say."

LoveLine's counselor, financial coach, and case manager are all equally impacted for the better by being on this roller coaster with Kara. Confident in the Lord and her love for her son, her example will be an enduring hope and strength in his life and ours.

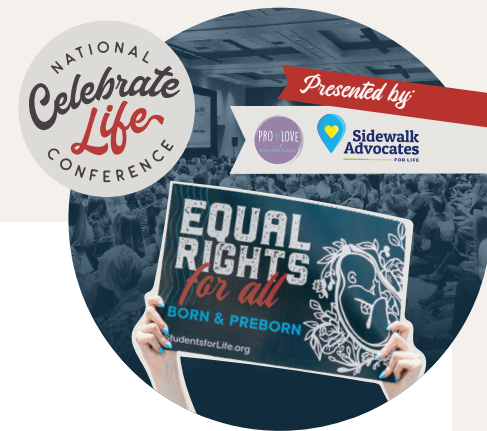
### Stubborn Hope:

## She wants to *thank you.*

Mama "K" grappled with her decision between life and death for her child. With God's intense love, LoveLine's counseling and case management services, and your financial support, she triumphantly chose life in 2024 for her baby. She wanted to thank you in her words:

"By the grace of God and His immeasurable love, I find myself with a different perspective in my personal life and towards life alone. My idea of a family life was perfection. I strived to be an example of faith for those around me, yet I did not set the example primarily in my own home. I had a sense of pride that I did not recognize then.

After my marriage failed, I was left with two little ones, and I immediately went into survival mode. I missed grieving everything that I had to say Goodbye to: the tradition of my girls having their parents together, my home, my job, my daughter's school, and a future with someone I thought I would spend the rest of my life with. My life quickly changed in an instant.

I was determined to stay alone for the rest of my life, but that also quickly shifted. I moved on with someone else, thinking that maybe, just maybe, that was God's plan for me. I made many decisions that led me to believe I wasn't the godly person I once knew; I didn't feel worthy. I felt ashamed.

God was calling me at every step, and I wouldn't listen. The time came when I couldn't ignore my conscience any longer. My heart was screaming out for God, and I realized how much I needed Him. The relationship that I struggled to leave turned into a pregnancy that made me feel stuck. The moment I found myself

saying yes to God, feeling so certain that I was going to leave a toxic relationship, I soon then found out that I was pregnant.

I couldn't believe that I was in a place where I would consider abortion. Who was I? Where was that Catholic that I thought I was? The battle inside my mind was so real that I cried out to God, and He heard me.

This year has been incredibly challenging. However, God has been with me, breaking down all the barriers the enemy had built before me (caused by my rebellion). The idea of abortion didn't have only to be rejected once, but many times. The enemy knew my weakness, and he continuously tested me. I had to say no many times and pray to God that I remain firm in His holy will.

Our God is so good, so powerful, and so loving. When we choose Him, there's nothing we can't overcome.

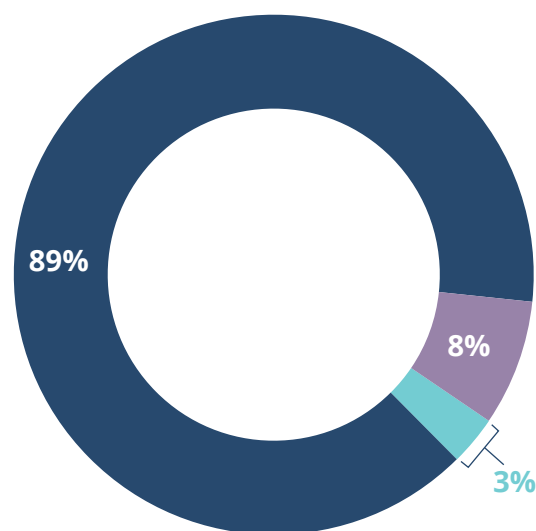
